1. Strike the phrase "75 child care development centers." and insert the phrase "by 75 child care development centers each year." in its place. (Line 533 of the ANS)
2. Strike the word "salary" and insert the phrase "base salary" in its place. (Line 566 of the ANS)
3. Strike the word "analysis;" and insert the phrase "analysis; updated to include the salary scale;" in its place. (Lines 604-605 of the ANS)
4. Strike "(i) OSSE shall not impose any work or educational requirements in determining eligibility to receive subsidized child care from a child development center or child development pursuant to section 11b." in its entirety. (Lines 798-800 of the ANS)

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To establish a Healthy Steps Pediatric Primary Care Demonstration Program to be administered by the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services ("DOH") to implement an interdisciplinary pediatric primary care program that uses a child development professional to assist families during well-child visits by providing guidance and information to promote healthy early childhood development and lactation support services, and to establish a Help Me Grow Program to be administered by DOH to serve as a comprehensive resource and referral system for child development and family support services, and to require DOH to conduct a comprehensive assessment of home visiting in the District, and to require DOH to issue grants to a nonprofit organization to enable the organization to provide services to homeless families with an infant or toddler residing in the DC General Family Shelter or DC General Family Shelter replacement units, and immigrant families, and to establish a Lactation Certification Preparatory Program to be administered by DOH, in coordination with an institution of higher education, and an existing provider of a lactation consultant preparatory course to provide instruction, assistance, and mentorship to individuals undertaking a career in lactation consulting, and to require DOH, in consultation with the Office of the State Superintendent for Education and the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department, to establish a community resource pilot program, and to require DOH to expand the number of child development centers providing child and family-centered behavioral health care services to health professionals and families with infants and toddlers or develop and implement another evidence-based program to provide those services in
